WHO	 You are eligible for the PGWP if you: Completed an NBCC program that was at least 8 months in length and led to a diploma or certificate, and Maintained full-time status during each semester of your program (some exceptions apply; see link). You can only receive a PGWP once in your life. WHAT	The PGWP is an open work permit meaning it is not tied to any specific location, type of work, or employer. You also do not need to have a job arranged to apply for it.
